4.1 Terms of membership

The current terms of the committee members are:

Two year terms, 2017-18, 2018-19: Chris Freeman, Rebecca Garwood, Garrett McSorley

Two year Term: 2018-2019, 2019-20: Brenna Goodman

One year term: 2018-19: Dayton Griffith, Aaron Hohl

Background:

Performance Audit Finding:

Our 2017-18 Performance Audit (see agenda item 6.1 below) found that one of our members, Dayton, is ineligible to serve on CBOC committee because he works for the District as a substitute teacher.

Without Dayton, there are two vacancies on the committee. One for a taxpayers organization representative and one for a senior citizen's representative. The District will continue to reach out to community members individually and through its website to recruit members to the committee.

Recommendation:

The Assistant Superintendent recommends the following terms for the committee members. This change will make committee member terms end in either 2020 or 2021.

Two year terms, 2019-20, 2020-21: Chris Freeman, Rebecca Garwood, Garrett McSorley

Two year Term: 2018-2019, 2019-20: Brenna Goodman

One year term: 2019-20: Aaron Hohl

4.2 Elect a Chairperson and a Vice-Chairperson

Action_____

The Chairperson is responsible for chairing the committee meetings and delivering committee reports to the Board.

The Vice-Chairperson acts as the Chairperson in her or his absence.

The committee by-laws prescribe that a Chair and Vice-Chair be elected once a year. Since the composition and terms of the committee membership has changed, the Assistant Superintendent recommends that the committee elect a Chair and Vice-Chair at this meeting.

5. AMEND BYLAWS

Action_____

Section 5.4 of the current By-laws does not allow committee members to serve more than three consecutive terms. The link below leads to Section 5.4. The Assistant Superintendent recommends that the Committee delete the text highlighted in yellow and insert the text highlighted in green. If approved, this change will be taken to the Board of Trustees as a recommendation to change the By-laws.

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6. BOND PROCEEDS

6.1 Performance Report by an Independent Auditor

Action _____

At the March 11, 2019 meeting of the Board they approved an audit service agreement with David L Moonie & Co. (DLM) to perform a Performance Audit on the Measure K General Obligation (GO) Bond of 2016. DLM audited the 2017-18 management of the bond fund by the District.

There were two findings in the audit, one regarding the minimum number of members of the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (CBOC) and another the status of one of the CBOC members.

Finding 1: The CBOC is required to have 5 members from specific stakeholder groups in the District. The CBOC needs one additional member from a taxpayer's organization to have a full component.

Finding 2: One of the members of the CBOC worked for the District as a substitute teacher. This is not permitted by the statute governing GO bonds. This member served on the CBOC as a representative of the stakeholder group, "senior citizen" and his term expires on June 30, 2019.

Finding 1. & 2: The District will continue to advertise for CBOC members on its website to fill the vacant positions on the CBOC.

This meeting can take place anytime after the Northern Humboldt Union School District closes the books for the District. Typically this is at the end of July.
